Speakers & Topics

Andy James is the Program Coordinator for the Institute of Renewable Natural Resources. As a program coordinator with the Texas A&M Institute of Renewable Natural Resources, James supports the Institute's extension and outreach efforts for various programs and projects. Prior to joining the institute, Andy was a research associate for the Borderlands Research Institute, leading white-tailed deer and mule deer research in west Texas. Research projects covered movements, habitat use, antler development and survival of both species. He was also associated with several restoration efforts for bighorn sheep and pronghorn conducted in the Trans-Pecos. James also spent nearly two years with the Natural Resources Conservation Service as a range management specialist in several counties of the panhandle region of Texas. Andy received a bachelor of science in Rangeland Ecology & Management at Texas A&M University and a master's degree in Natural Resources Management from Sul Ross State University. Andy will coordinate a team of speakers from USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service, including:

We will tour the MJ Hanna Ranch outside of Gatesville. The ranch is managed by the MJ Hanna Foundation and has been under the Hanna family ownership. The Hanna Ranch is a prime example of good private land stewardship. Topics will include soil health, grazing management, prescribed fire, wildlife management and brush management.

<u>Dr. Dale Cope</u> - Associate professor of engineering.

A 1982 distinguished ROTC graduate from Texas A&M, Dr. Dale Cope is a retired Air Force officer with over 20 years of experience in aircraft structures, as an engineer, instructor, and maintenance officer. His engineering experience spans the fields of design, liaison, and structural analysis. As an assistant professor at the US Air Force Academy and adjunct lecturer at Wichita State University, he has taught a variety of courses ranging from Fundamentals of Aeronautics to Aerospace Structural Analysis and Design. His teaching experience includes conducting seminars on aircraft structural repair for practicing engineers from Air Logistics Centers, Air Force Laboratories, and the aircraft industry. At present, his primary research interest is the applied research and development of unmanned aerial systems (UASs) for a wide variety of commercial and civil applications. He is currently participating in several research efforts with Texas A&M AgriLife Research related to using UASs for remote sensing. These efforts mostly involve using fixed-wing UASs with high resolution visual and multispectral cameras for various agriculture applications. Another effort involves the integration of multiple cameras and gas sensors including a thermal camera onto an octocopter UAS for monitoring infrastructure in oil and gas fields. Previously, Dr. Cope actively worked in the research area of aircraft structural integrity, performing airworthiness evaluations on civilian and military aircraft ranging from general aviation commuter airplanes to large military transport and bomber aircraft. His practical experience includes serving as the engineer on an aircraft battle damage repair team during Operation Desert Storm. Drawing from his practical field experience as a maintenance officer, Dale is able to relate complex engineering concepts to real world application. In addition to his B.S. from Texas A&M, Dale received his M.S. from the Air Force Institute of Technology and Ph.D. from Wichita State University.

<u>Jim Taylor & Judy Logan</u> are Owners of the Whitetail Deer of Texas. Jim and Judy are retired educators. In addition to raising cattle, they operate a scientific whitetail deer breeding program and are a TC1-Transfer Category 1 deer breeding operation. In 2012, they completed a state of the art deer facility for working the herd, including separating fawns, vaccinating animals and artificially inseminating does.

Eric Woomer is the Foundation Appraisers Coalition of Texas' Legislative Consultant. Eric is a governmental affairs consultant and lobbyist for business interests ranging from Fortune 100 companies to trade associations to family owned businesses. Eric has served as Chief of Staff and Legislative Director to three Texas state senators, both Republicans and Democrats, representing areas as diverse as the Texas Panhandle and the Houston Ship Channel. Eric successfully coordinated the legislative agendas, community activities, and media strategies for the senators, as well as directing personnel activities for staffs as large as twenty-one. Eric served as Press Secretary for U.S. Congressman J.J. "Jake" Pickle, and as a Senior Policy Advisor to U.S. Senator Kay Bailey Hutchison. Eric received a Bachelor of Arts degree in Government from the University of Texas in 1993. In 2002, he obtained his Masters of Public Affairs from the University of Texas' Lyndon Baines Johnson School of Public Affairs.

<u>Colonel Todd Fox</u> is a Garrison Commander at Fort Hood. As Garrison Commander, Col Fox is in charge of the day to day operations of Fort Hood, including the physical plants, roads, housing and security. He has served in that position since July 2015. Fox graduated from the United States Military Academy and was commissioned as an Armor officer in 1994. He has served in variety of positions at Fort Stewart, GA; Fort Hood, TX; Washington, DC; Schofield Barracks, Hawaii; and Camp Lemonnier, Djibouti. Col Fox holds a Master of Arts in National Security and Strategic Studies from the US Naval War College in Newport, RI; a Masters of Policy Management from Georgetown University in Washington, DC; and a Master of Arts in Strategic Studies from the US Army War College in Carlisle, PA.
